Welcome to the Pueblo of Isleta
Johnson-O'Malley Program! The JOM
Program is federally funded with the
mission of meeting the unique and
specialized educational needs of
Native American students enrolled in
public schools.

The Pueblo of Isleta JOM Program serves all Native American students in grades K—12th that are enrolled in the Los Lunas Public School District and only Isleta students enrolled in Albuquerque Public Schools, Isleta Elementary School, Santa Fe Indian School and School of Dreams Academy. Eligible students receive free educational support through our program. There is no out-of-pocket expense for the family or the student to receive services.

What is JOM?

- The JOM Program allows for the creation and implementation of various educational support programs and services to assist your student through school.
- The Pueblo of Isleta submits an annual contract proposal to the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) every year by October 1.
- The JOM program is the only Federal Program that emphasizes the importance of parent involvement. The Contract Proposal is created based on results from the Annual Needs Assessment.
- The JOM Program's operational budget is funded through the President's Annual budget or a continuing resolution. This year the JOM Program received \$52,432.
- Our contract year begins January 1 and ends
 December 31.





Who is eligible?

Native American Students enrolled in the
Los Lunas Public Schools and Isleta Students
enrolled in Albuquerque Public Schools,
Isleta Elementary School, Santa Fe Indian
School, and School of Dreams Academy.
Students must be 1/4 or more Native
American blood <u>or</u> be a member of a
federally recognized Tribe. Students must
have a Certificate of Indian Blood (CIB) on
file.
